President's <mark>Message</mark>



Dear Fellow Congregants.,

Now that we are well past the High Holidays, the focus of the Board, the committees, and the auxiliaries is to further the goals which we set for ourselves as the year began. There is so much which needs to be done and seemingly not enough hours in the day to get to everything.

As you may know, there are plans to begin long overdue renovations of our offices as well as bolstering the security and accessibility of our administration building. Hopefully, by the time you read this message, the work on the offices will already have commenced.

At the same time that we work on our physical house, we are planning to "remodel" the rules by which we administer the Congregation. There has been much discussion over the last couple of years that our Executive Committee and Board needed to be more transparent and operate within clearly defined guidelines. For that reason, a special committee was established within the Strategic Planning Task Force to deal with bylaws and governance.

The proposed new bylaws have already been passed over to the Executive Committee for final review. The hope is that the Board will be reviewing the new bylaws by January. If the Board approves the bylaws, they will come before a special Congregational meeting for a vote in early 2022. They would then become effective in the fiscal year beginning July, 1, 2022.

Making changes in an organization of our size is never easy. However, I am confident we are on the right track to getting some meaningful things done which will improve the membership experience of all of our congregants.



Thanksgiving is the ultimate Jewish holiday: gathering with family and friends; eating a whole lot of food; pausing to think about our blessings and what we have to be grateful for; these are things that Jewish people gather to do every week on Shabbat.

This year, the first candle of Hanukkah begins on the Sunday night immediately following Thanksgiving. Although we have imagined it before, this Hanukkah seems like the time of year when if all goes as most epidemiologists are predicting, the Covid-19 virus may finally be receding enough to allow us to think about returning to some semblance of life as we knew it before the pandemic.

If indeed this turns out to be the case, if indeed these Hanukkah lights mark the time when the darkness of the Covid pandemic finally begins to recede, it will resonate with the themes of the Hanukkah festival. Not in the sense that the pandemic resembles a war against a powerful army of soldiers bent on destruction. But analogous in the sense that over the past two years there were many times when it would have been easy to give in to despair: despair about the separation from our loved ones; despair about the polarization around health care policy that made it difficult for Americans to feel that they were battling a common enemy; despair that this disease kept morphing into something potentially more lethal. But with all our fits and starts as a nation, we Americans may have finally persevered enough to begin to put this pandemic behind us. Maybe that's why the proximity of Thanksgiving and Hanukkah resonates so much with me this year. We've had enough cynicism as a nation. It is time to celebrate what is possible to accomplish when challenges confront us and what we can do together when enough of us pull together.

So let's try to see the glass as half full. Let's remember to savor the gift of Thanksgiving celebrations with people we love and connect this uniquely American holiday to the vision of Hanukkah that reminds us that light will eventually overcome darkness.

May the pandemic truly become a thing of the past. And may our gratitude for all that we have help to illuminate the darkness as the winter approaches.

The Center for Spiritual Wellbeing (CSWB) continues to offer innovative programs:.

Our intimate Alternative Spiritual Experiences on both Zoom and in-person and led by Rabbi Glanzberg-Krainin on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur were filled with meditation, music, and learning.

Music for the Mind, led by Rabbi Beth Janus is geared to those who have Alzheimer's and Dementia and offers participants familiar, upbeat repetitive songs to sing along with or just enjoy, and is available in-person and via Zoom.

Our caregiver support group, led by the Alzheimer's Association and peer led, meets via Zoom one Wednesday a month and helps participants gain emotional support from others involved.

Dr. Lily Brown shared ways to manage anxiety with mindful solutions, relaxation techniques, and structured problem solving, and presented ways to feel confident about life choices and what lies ahead in the pandemic lifestyle.

Amy Brewstein led The Jewish Studio Project, creating art while learning Torah and becoming mindfully centered. Several more sessions will be coming.

Carol Nemeroff continued Mindful Meditation classes on Monday evenings and Wednesday mornings and introduced two Spiritual Direction groups which meet once a month.

Simcha Raphael explored the end-of-life journey of our biblical ancestors and the challenges of life and death today.

A peer-to-peer discussion group with topics including adult children living far away, adult children becoming ultra-orthodox, coping with a family member with a serious mental health challenge, caring for an aging parent, divorce, and widow/widower is being planned.

KARE4KIDS with Marlene Snyder on MLK Jr. Day will be making blankets for babies in need.

Contemplative Kabbalat Shabbat services led by Cantor Jacob Agar and Contemplative Saturday morning Shabbat service led by Rabbi David Glanzberg-Krainin will offer a meditative approach to prayers and chants with guided mediation.

Beth Sholom Preservation Foundation and the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation have joined to host an intimate exhibit, "Sacred Spaces", which launched at Beth Sholom on September 19, 2021 and will run through January 17, 2022. The show features images of Wright-designed buildings and guests will have an opportunity to purchase limited-edition, hand-numbered prints directly from the artist.



With great humility, Steve labored behind the scenes making it possible for us to do our thing. Steve never sought accolades or thanks, though he deserves more than we could ever give him. Steve did many things to show his support for me as his successor, and I have cautioned him that I will depend on his continued support throughout my term.

Men's Club has a longstanding tradition and a rich history that shape our identity. Men's Club remains an integral part of the congregation based upon the variety of spiritual, charitable, and entertaining events we sponsor throughout the year. Mr. Abrahamson taught us that volunteering is an excellent way to provide meaning to your life and help give back to your local community.


On September 23, 2021, the Men's Club presented the award to Bill Loy, a tireless supporter of our Men's Club and Synagogue. Thank you, Bill, for your remarkable support and unwavering leadership to our Club, Beth Sholom Congregation, and the local Jewish Community. In recognition of Bill's exemplary volunteer and leadership skills, Bill will be honored with other regional Men of the Year at the annual Middle Atlantic Region Man of the Year dinner on Sunday, March 27, 2022, at Adath Jeshurun. Congratulations to a most deserving honoree.

Bill's parents were born in Germany in the early 1900s. By the 1930s Shanghai was the only free port left, meaning that one did not need formal papers to enter, so his parents left Germany to live in China. They lived there from 1939 to 1949. Times were tough, but they survived and left separately to sail to America.

Bill often states that he was made in China and delivered in the USA. He was born in San Francisco two weeks after his mom, who spoke no English, arrived in the United States. His dad arrived just in time for Bill's birth. When Bill was six weeks old, his parents took a train to Philadelphia, where they knew people from Shanghai. They settled in Philadelphia at 41st and Girard and moved to Wynnefield when Bill was ten and entering 5th grade. Bill became a Bar Mitzvah at Temple B'Nai Aaron at 53rd Street near Euclid Avenue, and graduated from Overbrook High School and Penn State University.

Bill met his wife Judi at her High School graduation, where he drove her and her closest friend to various parties. They did not see each other for many months until he invited her to escort him to a formal affair with the ROTC. Their first date was a formal black-tie event. That was it! They were inseparable through four years of college at Penn State and were married in 1972 after Judi gave Bill an ultimatum: let's get married or else! Judi's mom wanted a June wedding, and her Synagogue was booking up quickly, and a deposit had to be paid immediately.

Bill worked in various executive retail management positions at Gimbels Department stores and Phillips Van Heusen for more than twenty years. He spent ten years as Executive Vice President in the Career Consulting Industry and then decided he wanted to work more closely with the Jewish Community. Bill has been with Montefiore Cemetery Company for almost twenty years and has served as the Marketing Director for over a decade. This job is the perfect fit for our honoree as helping people has always been his calling.



Judi and Bill joined Beth Sholom Congregation in 1983, and when his dad passed away in 1984, Bill began to say Kaddish daily. He was warmly welcomed by the other Minyanaires during morning and evening services and became friends with most of them. Since his parents were Holocaust survivors, Bill had no relatives other than his wife's family members. His Beth Sholom friends became his family members. He became involved in many synagogue activities, including Men's Club, and with a bit of nudging from Rabbi Landes and Michael Weingram, became Men's Club President in 1998. Bill has the unique distinction of being the only Men's Club President whose term spanned two centuries (1998 - 2001). As an integral member of the Beth Sholom Bylaws Committee, which guides Beth Sholom's operations and activities, Bill contributed to the review of all existing policies and procedures and assisted in proposals to change/amend existing bylaws. Since March 2020, Bill has participated and periodically led via Zoom during almost every evening Minyan. He has also attended most Kabbalat Shabbat, Shabbat and Havdalah services. Bill is incredibly thankful for all that he has received as a congregant at Beth Sholom and is pleased that opportunities arose to give back to others.

Bill believes that Men's Club has given him a place where he feels at home within our Synagogue and where he has established many of his friendships. He has stated that Men's Club is an easy way for guys to meet other guys in a non-competitive atmosphere, enjoy social, educational, and religious activities, and best of all, each other's company.

Judi and Bill have been married for 49 years with two devoted and beloved sons. Jason is a chemical engineer on Long Island with his wife Rachel and three children, Natalie, Emily, and Ethan. 


